My research centers the mental health experiences of Black Americans, with a particular focus on suicide prevention and mental health promotion. In this work I explore how strengths like meaning in life, coping, and social support protect against adverse outcomes and ultimately promote wellbeing. Additionally, I consider how measurement and psychological scale construction influence mental health experiences across race and gender groups. The overarching goal of my research is to identify the environmental, intra- and interpersonal factors that both prevent suicide and foster flourishing across the lifespan.
