

Dr. James Zhang is currently Director, Medicare Innovation Analysis at the University of Chicago. He brings in-depth skills and understanding of Medicare program evaluation and claim data analysis to improve the quality and efficiency of care to the elderly population. Previously, he has studied risk adjustment of multiple comorbidities and its implication to the Medicare costs. He has also analyzed specialty care, inpatient care, post-acute care and end-of-life care in the Medicare program. More recently, he has studied Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Program and Part B payment reform.

James is an author and co-author of more than 100 journal articles, editorial commentaries, book chapters, and professional conference presentations, with a few articles being cited over 70 times each and total number of times cited over 500 times in the literature. His lead-author articles have appeared in a number of leading journals, including Medical Care, Journal of American Geriatrics Society, American Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry, American Journal of Public Health, and Journal of General Internal Medicine.

Nationally and internationally, James has served on the advisory board of interest group of AcademyHealth, the Scientific Committee of American Society of Health Economists (ASHEcon), the Scientific Committee of International Health Economics Association (IHEA), the Research Review Committee and Judge for International Society for Pharmacoeconomics and Outcome Research (ISPOR), and as referees of medical research granting bodies of two governments of "Asian Tigers." He has been invited to present his research findings in the international professional conferences at Copenhagen, Dublin, Paris, and Venice, among others.
